Additional focus areas

The local analysis included 13 local documents and 69 interviews. Based on the local expertise, we were able to identify relevant issues that needed more attention in the local indicator set. Those are the highlights:

LGBTQ2+

Non-binary gender is a reality present in our everyday lives and a group we can't leave behind.

MENTAL HEALTH

It affects a significant number of people of all ages with negative impact to our social and economic well-being.

URBAN AGRICULTURE

London is situated in one of the most fertile regions of Canada and sustainable food production must include urban areas.

WEALTH INEQUALITY

Distribution of wealth is far more relevant than economic growth.
